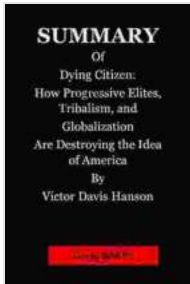

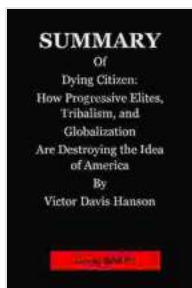
The Way Forward

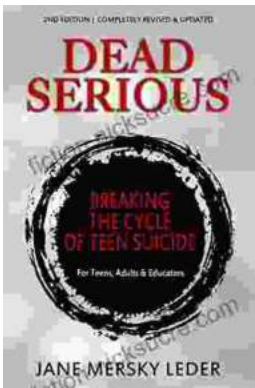

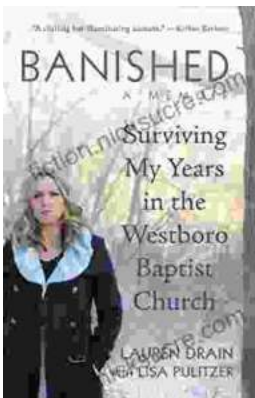
