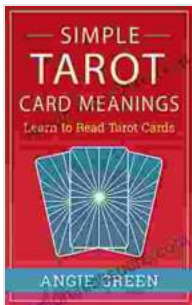

The Star	Hope, inspiration, renewal
The Moon	Intuition, dreams, subconscious
The Sun	Success, happiness, joy
Judgement	Rebirth, renewal, transformation
The World	Completion, fulfillment, success

## The Minor Arcana

The Minor Arcana consists of 56 cards, which are divided into four suits: Wands, Cups, Swords, and Pentacles. Each suit represents a different aspect of your life, and the cards within each suit represent different experiences or events.

Suit	Meaning
Wands	Passion, creativity, energy
Cups	Emotions, relationships, love
Swords	Intellect, communication, conflict

Suit	Meaning
Pentacles	Money, work, stability

The Minor Arcana cards are often used to represent everyday events and experiences. They can provide you with insights into your current situation and help you to make decisions about your future.

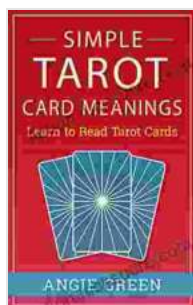

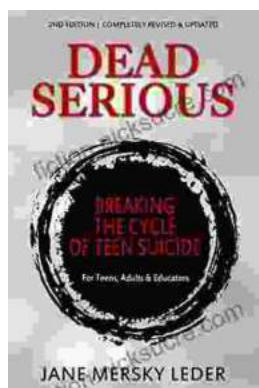
