
The Red Or: How to Play Indian I Directions for Organizing Tribe of Boy Indians

How to Play The Red Or

To play The Red Or, you will need the following supplies:

- A game board
- Two sets of pieces (each set should have 12 pieces)



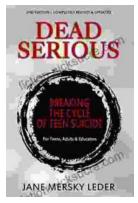

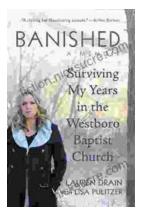
