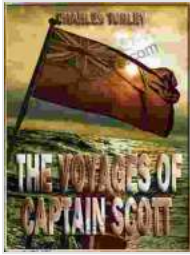

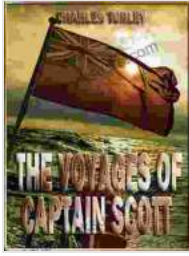


Scott and his team on the Terra Nova Expedition

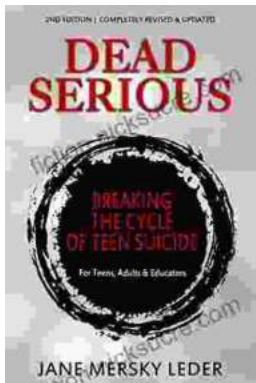

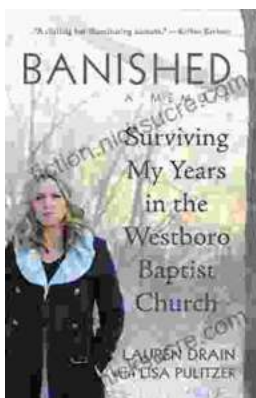
